Management of caves and other karst presents unique challenges to land managers, in part because these underground management units are often poorly understood, difficult to delineate, easy to ignore. I present several examples of how research on cave invertebrates informs management, with emphasis placed on the federally listed Illinois Cave Amphipod, karst invertebrate communities of central Texas, and examples the use of cave bioinventories in management.
